

Detecting a gas leak.

Because natural gas is colorless and has no scent we add a strong deodorant that smells like rotten eggs to help you detect a possible gas leak. If you suspect a gas leak, call LPMU (832-3667) immediately. We will investigate a gas leak for free.

Signs of a natural gas leak or damaged pipeline

The unintentional release of natural gas is dangerous to you, the public and could result in fire, explosions, injury or death. Take action by calling LPMU (832-3667) if you:

- Hear hissing, roaring or whistling sounds near a gas appliance, meter or pipeline.
- See blowing dirt, bubbling water or dissolved vegetation in an otherwise green area, or a gas meter dial that continues to move after all natural gas appliances and equipment have been shut off.
- Smell the odor of rotten egg. If you don't know the scent, contact us for a free scratchand-sniff card.


2010 Census: Population of 1105

WINTER REMINDER

Parking Snow Ban—Between Nov 1st and Mar 31st no vehicle shall be left standing or parked on City streets between the hours of 2:00am and 6:00am or at any time during the day or night in which snow removal operations are in progress. Fines for the 1st offense will be \$25. For all subsequent offenses, the fine will be \$50.

NEW SEWER RATE

You may have heard some talk about a new sewer lagoon being built. There are new requirements with our permit that cannot be met with the current system. Over the next few years we will be building a new system. Unfortunately a new system carries a big price tag. In preparation of this cost the council has voted to implement a Sewer Improvement Rate. This rate will be added to each sewer bill. Beginning January 1st this rate will be \$10.00 per month. The collected fees will be held in a separate fund to be used for the sanitary improvement project.
